Criteria for Preference of Enrolment in Integrated Catholic Schools

1. At Hato Pāora College we select preference students on the following grounds.

(5.1) The child has been baptised or is being prepared for baptism in the Catholic Church.

(5.2) The child's parents/guardians have already allowed one or more of its siblings to be baptised in the Catholic faith.

(5.3) At least one parent/guardian is a Catholic, and although their child has not yet been baptised, the child's participation in the life of the school could lead to the parents having the child baptised.

(5.4) With the agreement of the child's parent/guardian, a grandparent or other significant adult in the child's life, such as an aunt, uncle or godparent, undertakes to support the child's formation in the faith and practices of the Catholic church.

(5.5) One or both of a child's non-Catholic parents/guardians is preparing to become a Catholic.

(5.6) The child's immediate family has an established connection to Hato Pāora College. This occurs by the boy's maternal or paternal uncles or grandfathers having attended the College.

2. State integrated schools have places for non-preference students.

Non-preference places criteria:

- i. The applicants accept that they will be attending a school of special character and that their place in the school is conditional on their participation in the programme.
- ii. The applicants accept that they will be required to pay attendance dues as set by the Proprietor and these are not voluntary

Non-preference criteria that apply to Hato Pāora College.

- i. The siblings of non-preference students already in the school
- ii. Siblings of former non-preference students
- iii. The children of staff or Board members

Non-preference students who cannot enrol immediately may choose to be placed on a waiting list.

3. There are no Non-Preference places likely to be available in 2021.
